

Be it Remembered that the Common Council of the City of Plymouth, Indiana, met in regular session on July 22, 2013. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers of the City Building, 124 N. Michigan Street, Plymouth, Indiana. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Senter led the Pledge of Allegiance and Councilman Delp offered prayer.

Senter presided for Council Members Delp, Culp, Ecker, and Smith. Clerk-Treasurer Hutchings, City Engineer Gaul and City Attorney Surrisi were also present. Councilman Grobe was absent.

Councilmen Delp and Culp moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting on July 8, 2013 and to dispense with reading them since they have been reviewed and found to be correct. The motion carried.
