

Be it Remembered that the Common Council of the City of Plymouth, Indiana, met in regular session on May 13, 2013. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers of the City Building, 124 N. Michigan Street, Plymouth, Indiana. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Senter led the Pledge of Allegiance and Councilman Ecker offered prayer.

Senter presided for Council Members Culp, Ecker, Smith and Grobe. Clerk-Treasurer Hutchings, City Engineer Gaul and City Attorney Surrisi were also present. Councilman Delp was absent.

Councilmen Ecker and Grobe moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting on April 29, 2013 and to dispense with reading them since they have been reviewed and found to be correct. The motion carried.

Councilmen Grobe and Smith moved and seconded to open the public hearing. The motion carried.

City Attorney Surrisi explained that the additional appropriation is for the \$100,000 donation to the Community Resource Center that was approved at the last meeting.

Dr. Liechty assured the council that the funds would be used to tear down the eyesore on Jefferson Street and be leveraged to make a big difference in terms of that property and the services provided through that property to the persons of the community.

Wilson Gerrard voiced concern that under the Constitution of the United States of America, that if you give them the money, it opens the door for other people whose requests, as non-profits, cannot be refused.

There being no other questions or comments from the audience or councilmen, Councilmen Culp and Smith moved and seconded to close the public hearing. The motion carried.

Councilman Culp thanked Street Superintendent Marquardt for the placement of the “no parking” signs on West Harrison Street as well as for contacting the homeowner at 901 N Michigan Street to place their garbage and recycling bins on Harrison Street instead of Michigan Street.

Councilman Ecker concurred.

He said that the employees from 3M would like to solicit funds at the corner of Michigan and Jefferson Streets on Saturday, June 15, 2013 from 8 am to noon for Relay for the Life for the American Cancer Society.

Councilmen Smith and Culp moved and seconded to approve the application as presented. The motion carried.
