

Be it Remembered that the Common Council of the City of Plymouth, Indiana, met in regular session on September 8, 2014. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers of the City Building, 124 N. Michigan Street, Plymouth, Indiana. The meeting was called to order at 6:40 p.m.

Mayor Senter led the Pledge of Allegiance and Councilman Delp offered prayer.

Mayor Senter presided for Council Members Delp, Culp, Ecker, Smith and Grobe. City Engineer Gaul, City Attorney Surrisi and Clerk-Treasurer Hutchings were also present.

Councilmen Delp and Ecker moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting of August 25, 2014, and to dispense with reading them since they have been reviewed and found to be correct. The motion carried.

City Attorney Surrisi presented Resolution No. 2014-625, A Resolution of the City of Plymouth to Correct Clerical Error on Tax Abatement Statement of Benefit Forms, for Composite Technology Assembles, LLC. He noted that the vacant building deduction form had to be changed to note that it is only the value of the real property improvements, the actual building that had been vacant for more than a year that is eligible for the deduction, not the total value of the real estate and the improvements. He said that the other two corrections are based on state regulations and how the county deals with those. He said that there were a couple of items that had been included in the personal property that are actually considered real property and vice versa.

Board Members Smith and Grobe moved and seconded to adopt Resolution No. 2014-625, A Resolution of the City of Plymouth to Correct Clerical Error on Tax Abatement Statement of Benefit Forms, for Composite Technology Assembles, LLC. It passed by roll call vote.

The motion carried.

There being no further business to discuss, Councilmen Grobe and Delp moved and seconded to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried; the meeting was declared adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
