

REGULAR SESSION, COMMON COUNCIL, JUNE 10, 2013

Be it Remembered that the Common Council of the City of Plymouth, Indiana, met in regular session on June 10, 2013. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers of the City Building, 124 N. Michigan Street, Plymouth, Indiana. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Senter led the Pledge of Allegiance and Councilman Delp offered prayer.

Senter presided for Council Members Delp, Culp, Smith and Grobe. Deputy Clerk-Treasurer Xaver, City Engineer Gaul and City Attorney Surrisi were also present. Councilman Ecker and Clerk-Treasurer Hutchings were absent.

Councilmen Delp and Culp moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting on May 28, 2013 and to dispense with reading them since they have been reviewed and found to be correct. The motion carried.

City Attorney Surrisi referred to the Whitley Products tax abatement. He said that he has investigated the matter and found that the equipment is still at the Plymouth facility, so he recommended that the council accept the CF1 Personal Property filing by Whitley Products, noting that this is just for whatever portion of this year that Whitley is claiming the abatement and that once the new company is in place, the city can address the situation.

Councilmen Smith and Culp moved and seconded to accept the CF1 for Personal Property for Whitley Products. The motion carried.

Councilman Delp referred to the property that is for sale close to the fire department. He wondered if the city had considered purchasing the property.

Mayor Senter said that they were aware of it and had considered obtaining the property, but have decided against it.

Mayor Senter read the following email from Kevin Maxwell:

Good Morning Mr. Hite,

I am new to the city, and live over on Lake Avenue. Just wanted to take a second to thank you, and all of your employees on the great work you have been doing in Centennial park. The park has been looking fantastic this summer, and I specifically want to comment on how great the mulch around the Conservation Club House looks. It is amazing what some bright mulch can do for the overall look of a building. I recently attended an open house at that location and the whole area looks incredible. Thanks for what you've done, and keep up the great work!

Senter offered the privilege of the floor to members in the audience. No one accepted.

Councilmen Delp and Culp moved and seconded to accept the following communications: minutes of the Board of Public Works and Safety meeting of May 28, 2013; minutes of the Downtown Revitalization Committee meeting of May 1, 2013; minutes of the Plan Commission meeting of May 7, 2013, minutes of the Board of Zoning Appeals meeting of May 7, 2013; and the Clerk-Treasurer's Financial Reports for May 2013. The motion carried.

There being no further business to discuss, Councilmen Smith and Culp moved and seconded to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried; the meeting was declared adjourned at 6:38 p.m.
