

REGULAR SESSION, COMMON COUNCIL, SEPTEMBER 23, 2013

Be it Remembered that the Common Council of the City of Plymouth, Indiana, met in regular session on September 23, 2013. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers of the City Building, 124 N. Michigan Street, Plymouth, Indiana. The meeting was called to order at 6:38 p.m.

Mayor Senter led the Pledge of Allegiance and Councilman Delp offered prayer.

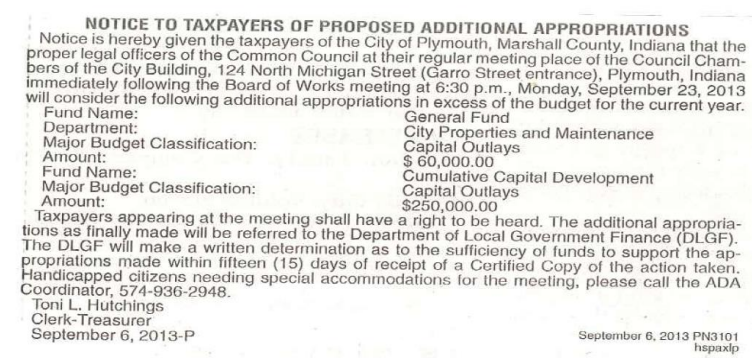
Senter presided for Council Members Delp, Culp, Ecker, Smith and Grobe. Clerk-Treasurer Hutchings, City Engineer Gaul and City Attorney Surrisi were also present.

Councilmen Delp and Culp moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting on September 9, 2013 and to dispense with reading them since they have been reviewed and found to be correct. The motion carried.

Mayor Senter recognized Redevelopment Commission President Don Wendel and read a Proclamation and presented him with a Certificate of Public Recognition in his honor.

Wendel thanked the mayor, clerk-treasurer, city council and city employees for the opportunity to work with them and to serve the public.

The following legal notice was advertised on September 6, 2013:



Councilmen Ecker and Smith moved and seconded to open the public hearing for the additional appropriations. The motion carried.

City Attorney Surrisi explained that the additional appropriations are for the improvements at the fire station and the purchase of the ambulance.

There being no other comments and no questions, Councilmen Delp and Smith moved and seconded to close the public hearing. The motion carried.

Councilman Smith said that he will most likely be absent from the October 14th meeting.

City Attorney Surrisi presented Ordinance No. 2013-2068, An Ordinance of the City of Plymouth Subjecting it to Marshall County Ordinance No. 2007-13 Concerning Registration of Contractors, on second reading. He explained that it appears this would also eliminate the licensing of electricians through the City of Plymouth.

City Attorney Surrisi reported on the Plymouth Commercial Revitalization Rebate Program Application from Robert Listenberger for property at 111½ North Michigan Street.

Listenberger said that he is having exterior work done, including tuck pointing and painting the exterior façade of the building. The low quote is in the amount of \$3,592.00.

Councilmen Delp and Smith moved and seconded to adopt Resolution No. 2013-582, A Resolution of the Common Council of the City of Plymouth to Approve the Application of Robert Listenberger for a Commercial Revitalization Rebate Program Grant, which reimburses Listenberger 20% of the amount spent, not to exceed \$3,592.00. It passed by roll call vote.

Councilmen Culp and Ecker moved and seconded to approve the request for October 5th from 9 to 1, contingent on the receipt of the waiver forms. The motion carried.

City Attorney Surrisi presented Resolution No. 2013-579, Additional Appropriations Resolution.

Chief Miller explained that the funds are being appropriated this year, but will be paid for next year.

Councilmen Ecker and Smith moved and seconded to pass Resolution No. 2013-579, Additional Appropriations Resolution. It passed by roll call vote.
