

REGULAR SESSION, BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY, January 8, 2024

The Board of Public Works and Safety of Plymouth, Indiana, met in Regular Session at 6:00 p.m. on January 8, 2024. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers, on the second floor of the City Building, 124 N. Michigan St., Plymouth, Indiana.

Mayor Listenberger called the meeting to order. Listenberger presided for Board Members Don Ecker Jr, Duane Culp, Shiloh Milner and Dave Morrow who were physically present. City Attorney Houin and Clerk-Treasurer Gorski were present. The public was able to see and hear the meeting through Microsoft Teams.

Board Members Culp and Milner moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the regular session of the Board of Public Works and Safety meeting of December 27, 2023. The motion carried.

Board Members Ecker and Culp moved and seconded to set the 2024 meeting dates for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Mondays of each month at 6:00 p.m. with the exceptions of moving the May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2024 meeting to the following day on May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024 and the November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024 meeting to the following day on November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. The motion carried.

Airport Manager Sheley states November 12<sup>th</sup> is also the same night for the Board of Aviation Commissioners meeting. He asks if they should plan to have it somewhere else.

Gorski responds by stating that is an option or it could be pushed out a day as well.

**Bid Opening for Commerce Street Paving Project**

He states he spoke with the Clerk-Treasurer already and was told that it was fine to start on that process. He explains they are looking for a ¾ Ton Pickup, a large dump truck, a possible bed replacement on another dump truck, etc. He states with how the market is, he is unsure if they will get a price for a dump truck and if not, they may look at some other equipment that is in their Five-Year Capital Asset Plan as they have done that before.

Board Members Culp and Milner moved and seconded to approve the request as presented. The motion carried.


Board Members Ecker and Culp moved and seconded to allow the claims for January 8, 2024, as entered in Claim Register #2024-1. The motion carried.
